BACKGROUND: Since opening the time capsule from 1970, staff has been recovering various documents and will be bringing items to the Council through November 2020.

With the 7th presentation of items for the time capsule we are looking at some more fun items from their 100th celebration. The buried treasure had clues for the people who bought the maps and allowed the public to have fun searching for the “gold.” Over 250 citizens were involved in the “Bustles to Bikinis” production, which included a few entire families. In a news article in the June 18, 1970 edition of the Rockport Pilot, they noted that only five (5) of the 126 buried tressure certificates had been found. The total "gold" to be found was \$1,000.



Buried Treasure

There are many tales of buried treasure in the area. At Vinson's Slough, on the north end of St. Joseph's Island, a great treasure of gold and silver church vessels is said to be buried, from a wrecked Spanish galleon. The island can only be reached by boat and all the landmarks have been washed away in storms, but some day some lucky man may find the statues, vessels and other things made of pure gold and silver.



Lafitte

Old timers claim that Lafitte once operated from Matagorda and St. Joseph's islands, issuing forth into the Gulf through Cedar Bayou, which was deeper then. He sank a great ship, laden with over \$500,000 in treasure off northern Padre Island and is supposed to have buried some of that on Padre Island, near the present site of Corpus Christi.

His real treasure, however, is said to be buried somewhere near the site of his fort, which is supposed to have been in the same general neighborhood where the home of the late Sid Richardson still stands. There is \$2,000,000 in gold and jewels in this treasure, somewhere near the mouth of the Lavaca River.



Jean Beranger, an old Frenchman, explored Aransas and Copano bays more than 240 years ago and in his memoirs related the brutal customs of the Indians, confirming the fact that the Carancahuas were cannibals. His map showed Lydia Ann Channel, Aransas and Copano bays, and Live Oak Peninsula.

He landed on Live Oak Peninsula, which he thought was an island, but was prevented from entering Copano Bay by the shallow oyster reefs across its mouth. His men landed to gather acorns and encountered a 15 foot alligator. He left a lead plate somewhere on the peninsula, at the foot of an "easily recognizable oak tree" and sailed away, but not before his men had killed a rattlesnake 7 feet, 8 inches long, and 8 inches around.

"Map of Gold"

The tales of Parata Oro come to life as you dig for buried vessels in the treasure spots of Rockport. Share with the Jolly Rogers of Lafitte's day the search for landmarks that will lead to treasures of gold. But guard your map well, for it will fall in the hands of pirates who will claim the treasure it will lead you to.

Each sea dog searching for treasure must follow the rules of digging less he be unable to redeem his vessel for gold (U.S. cash).

Ye must carry a 'Mapa de Oro' and have your name in blood ink upon it.

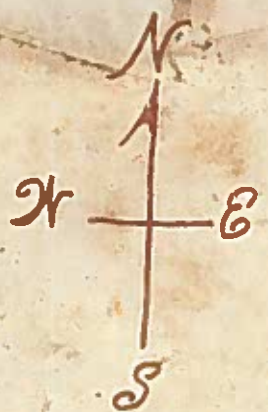

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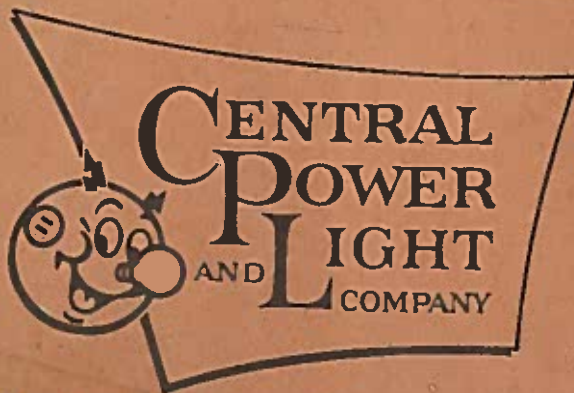
