RFQ for Engineering Services for Street Rehabilitation Projects.

RFQ – Questions and Answers

Q1: Would you please confirm whether you would like to include Geotechnical services in this submittal?

A1: No, Geotechnical services do not need to be included.

Q2: Would you define the roadway improvement limits, beginning and ends?

A2: See attached.

Q3: The Proposal Requirements list “Reference (minimum of 3 relevant projects),” but the Engineer Rating Sheet lists “References, Staff Level/Experience of Staff.” Would you clarify if you want a reference for 3 projects or for each staff member?

A3: Please list a minimum of 3 relevant projects that highlight your firm’s success. Include staff qualifications for those who will be on the project if selected. Your references may be the City or company your firm worked with on the relevant projects.

Q4: What are the limits of each roadway project?

A4: See attached.

Q5: Do these projects include drainage analysis for storm systems, or has that already been done?

A5: No drainage analysis is needed.

Q6: What is the source of funding for the project?

A6: City-funded; no grants are involved.

Q7: Is this one selection or will multiple firms be awarded?

A7: One firm will be selected.

Q8: Can you clarify whether the “Project Understanding & Approach” and “Detailed Scope of Work” sections will be scored as part of the evaluation, and if so, what are the scoring criteria?

A8: Proposals will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- **Firm Experience with Similar Projects:** 50%
- **Staff Qualifications:** 25%
- **Schedule:** 15%
- **References:** 10%

Market Street Improvements


1200 ft x 60 ft / 9 = 8,000 sq yds
