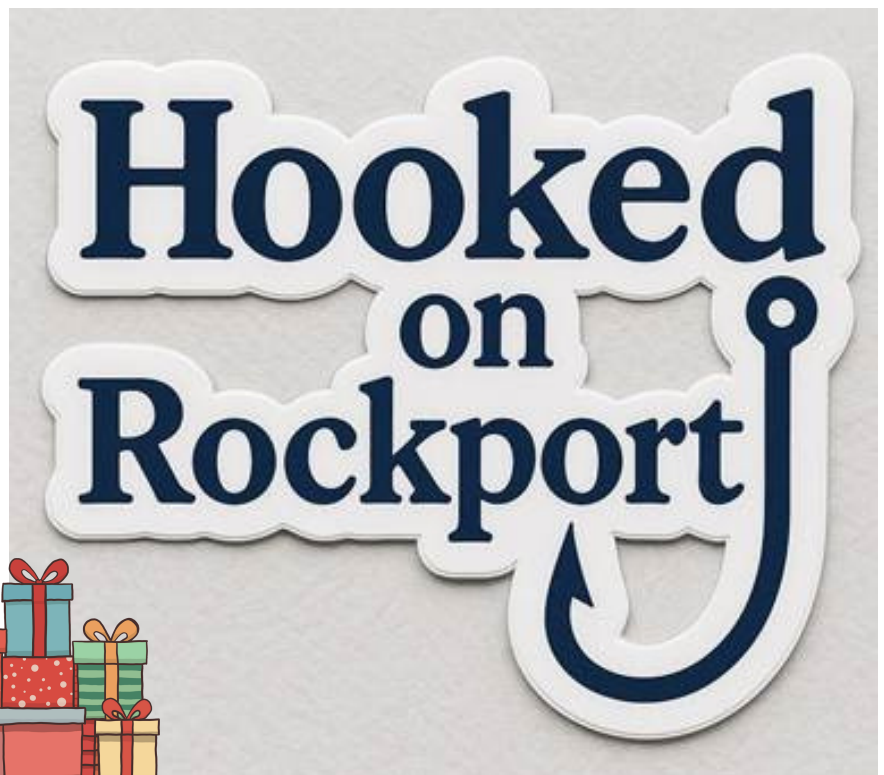

The City of Rockport hosted its inaugural City Showcase on Wednesday, October 22, 2025, at the Rockport Center for the Arts. ## Frequently Asked Questions

1. Does Drought Status Stage 3 mean water restrictions?

Yes, Stage 3 means we need to pause outdoor water use to protect our water supply. This includes temporarily stopping lawn watering, at-home car washing, and operating decorative fountains. Indoor water use like showering, laundry, and dishes can continue as normal.

2. Who is affected by Stage 3 water restrictions?

Restrictions apply to all City of Rockport water customers, including homeowners, apartment buildings, city facilities, commercial businesses, and industry.

3. Will I be billed a surcharge on my water bill?

No. There are no active surcharges for water usage.

4. Can I fill my pool?

Yes, filling pools is permitted at this time to maintain equipment operations. Residents are encouraged to cover pools as often as possible to prevent evaporation.

- Any change in occupancy type must be reported to the City prior to making that change.

- Sections R110.1 and R105.5 pertain to residential structures.
- Sections [A]111.1 and [A]111.4 pertain to commercial buildings.

## BEHIND THE PROJECTS

### Non-Grant Related Projects:

The City Hall project continues to move forward as we work through remaining punch list and warranty items. A Construction Settlement Agreement has been negotiated with Teal Construction Company, and staff are monitoring the final stages of closeout. The Rockport Volunteer Fire Department Building is now 99% complete, with substantial completion expected by November 20, 2025. The contractor is currently addressing punch list items as the project nears final completion.

### Grant-Related Projects:

The GLO CDBG Disaster Grant includes multiple drainage improvement projects that experienced delays due to the bankruptcy of the original contractor. Progress continues in each area: the Tule project is approximately 85% complete with expected completion in February 2025; the Ann and Hackberry improvements are fully complete; Market Street is 99% complete with only minor change order work remaining; and the Orleans Street project is currently in litigation related to latent defects.

The ARPA Grant and Unspent Bond Funds for upgrades to the Wastewater Treatment Plant are nearly complete, with the project at 99% completion and substantial completion anticipated by mid-December 2025. The HMGP Enterprise/Maple Drainage Projects have faced multiple Requests for Information (RFIs) from TDEM and may ultimately be removed from funding consideration due to conflicts with other ongoing projects.

The TDA CDBG Holly/Kluge Street Improvement Project is complete except for final punch list items. The TDEM HMGP Generators Project, which includes four stationary generators and two mobile generators, is progressing as the engineer finalizes the Request for Proposal documents.

The GLO Mitigation/Modernization Grant will provide additional drainage improvements in the Sabinal Street area, as well as the installation of underground fiber extending from the new City Hall down Pearl Street to the Rockport Service Center. This project was recently awarded, and staff are currently completing environmental review requirements. Similarly, the GLO/CMP Grant for the Tule Lake Regional Stormwater Retrofit Project was recently awarded, and staff are working with the grant administrator and engineer to respond to an RFI from the GLO.
